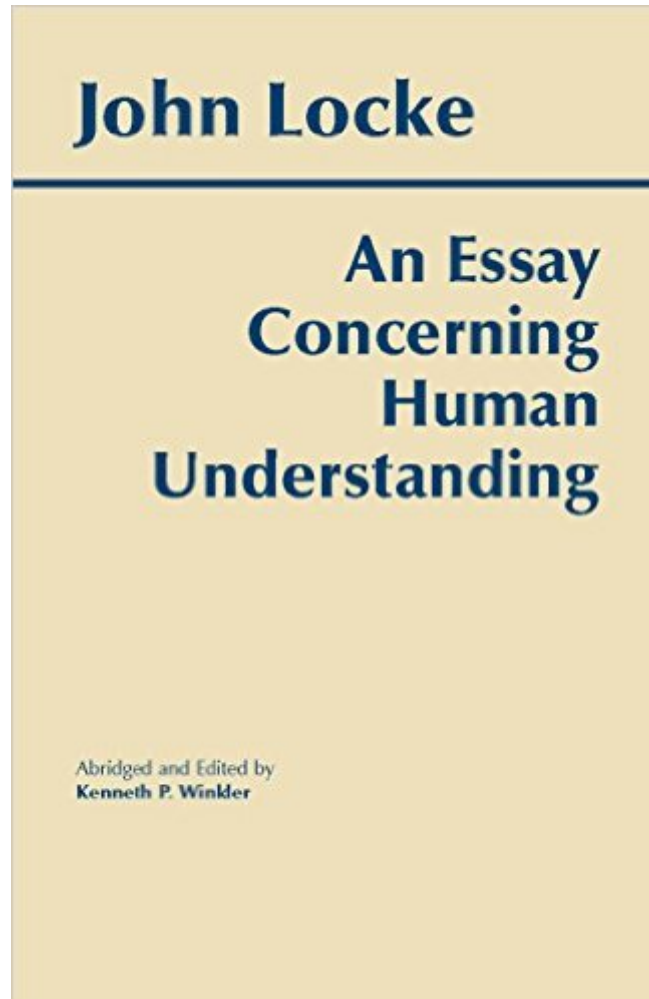


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An Essay Concerning Human Understanding (Hackett Classics)
